#### FAIR HOUSING MONTH PROCLAMATION

A Proclamation has been made by the Commissioners of Brown County, State of Ohio, that the month of April, 2015, be proclaimed **FAIR HOUSING MONTH** for the Citizens of Brown County, State of Ohio.

**WHEREAS**, the 90<sup>th</sup> Congress of the United State of America in accordance with its responsibilities to the Constitution of the United States of America, that all citizens be guaranteed Equal Housing Opportunities.

**WHEREAS**, Public Law 90-284, 90<sup>th</sup> Congress under House Rule 2516, April 11, 1968, an act be enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled Title VII of the 1968 Civil Rights Act. Fair Housing and Title VII as amended by Section 808 (b) (1), (2), and (3) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 Public Law 93-383, 93<sup>rd</sup> Congress, August 22, 1974.

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has adopted regulations to implement the changes made by the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 to Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968.

**WHEREAS**, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 a national policy declared by Congress to provide Fair Housing throughout the United States. The law makes discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex or national origin and now handicap or a family with children illegal in connection with the sale or rental of most housing and any vacant land offered for residential construction or use.

**THEREFORE, WE**, the undersigned duly elected as Commissioners representing, the Citizens of Brown County, State of Ohio, do hereby issue this to the Citizens of Brown County, that April, 2015, is hereby designated as Fair Housing Month in celebrating this historical policy which guarantees all citizens the right to provide themselves and their family with decent and safe housing.

**Whereas**, Sexual Assault Awareness Month is intended to draw attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every community member of Brown County and;

**Whereas**, rape, sexual assault and sexual harassment impact our community as seen by statistics indicating a 262% increase in reported rapes in Brown County over an one year period and indicating that one in five women and one in seventy-one men will be raped at some point in in their lives (Black et al., 2011).; and

**Whereas**, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in six boys and one in four girls will experience a sexual assault before the age 18 (Dube et al., 2005).; and


**Whereas**, young people experience heightened rates of sexual violence, and youth ages 12-17 were 2.5 times more likely to be victims of rape or sexual assault (Snyder & Sickmund, 2006).; and

**Whereas**, we must work together to educate our community about sexual violence prevention, supporting survivors, and speaking out against harmful attitudes and actions; and


**Whereas**, with leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is evidence that we can be successful in preventing sexual violence in Brown County increased education, awareness, and community involvement; and


**Whereas**, we the Brown County Board of Commissioners strongly supports the efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every citizen, to actively engage in public and private efforts to prevent sexual violence. It's time for all of us to start conversations, take appropriate action and support one another to create a safer environment for all.




